During the six (6) month closure of the station, the following works will occur, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Reconstruction of platform 1 and 2 to improve accessibility
- Relocation of in-ground services, construction of new platform retaining walls, installation of new shade canopies and installation of new station furniture (seating, bins etc)
- Installation of temporary services including CCTV, wayfinding, signage, lighting and ticketing
- Installation of temporary pedestrian overpass with stair access to platforms 1 and 2.

During the station closure, pedestrian access will still be maintained over the rail corridor between Lake Street and Fairfield Road via a temporary overpass. Pedestrians will not be able to access the platforms or construction area during the closure.

# Why is the closure of Yeronga station necessary?

- The station closure allows for the reconstruction of the existing platforms to occur more efficiently and safely
- Reduces the number of station and platform access changes for customers around active construction areas
- Shortens the overall construction duration by approximately twelve months
- Significantly less construction work will be required on weekends and night shifts.

# What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Temporary traffic changes on Fairfield Road.
  Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators, frontend loaders, mobile cranes, vacuum trucks, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment
- Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.

#### Introducing route 109 - your StationLink

To support customers during the closure, new route 109 – StationLink – will be introduced, running between Moorooka and Boggo Road stations.

StationLink will service two new stops at Yeronga station, on Fairfield Road, as well as two existing stops near Ovendean Street.

You'll be able to track StationLink in real time on the MyTransLink app, and plan your new journey with TransLink's journey planner.

#### Parking and active travel

During the closure, some parking will still be available on Lake Street and the Yeronga station commuter car park on Fairfield Road will remain open for people wishing to catch StationLink, cycle, or walk to a neighbouring station.

The closest stations to Yeronga are Fairfield station towards the City (approximately 8 minute cycle, 20 minute walk) or Yeerongpilly station towards Beenleigh (approximately 3 minute cycle, 13 minute walk).
